Data Interpretation Notes

Non-Mutually Exclusive Categories

Mental Health (MH) and Substance Use Disorder (SUD) categories are not mutually exclusive. Individuals may meet criteria for both MH and SUD within the same visit or admission. As a result, category-specific percentages may sum to greater than 100%.

Substance Use Categories

Substance categories (e.g., alcohol, opioids, stimulants, other) are also not mutually exclusive. Individuals may be represented in multiple substance categories if more than one substance is documented during a visit or admission.

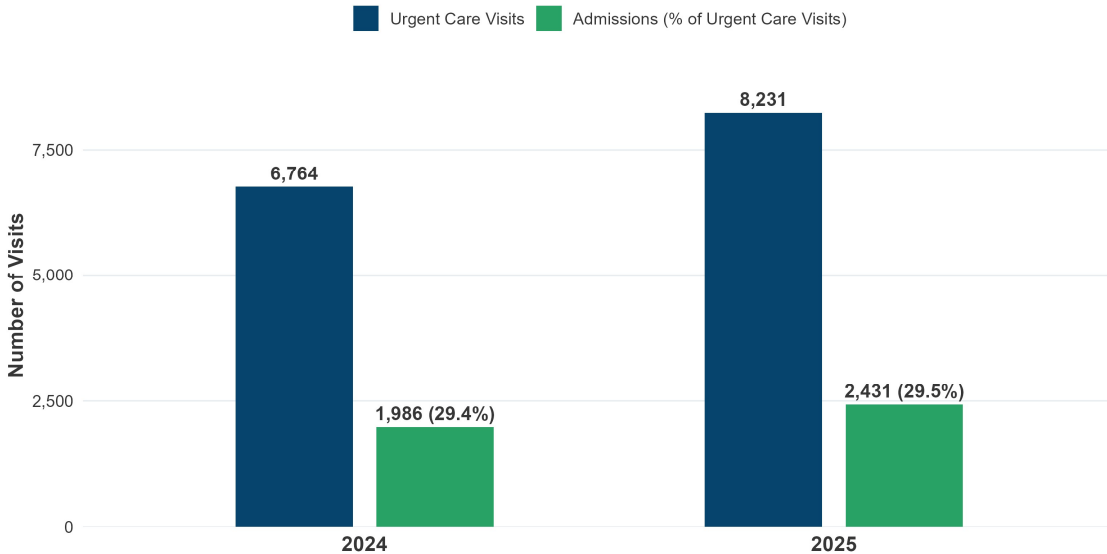
Small Cell Suppression

To protect patient confidentiality and ensure data reliability, counts fewer than 20 individuals may be suppressed or aggregated into broader categories. Suppressed values are not displayed and may appear as “Suppressed” or be included within grouped categories (e.g., “Other” or “<20”).

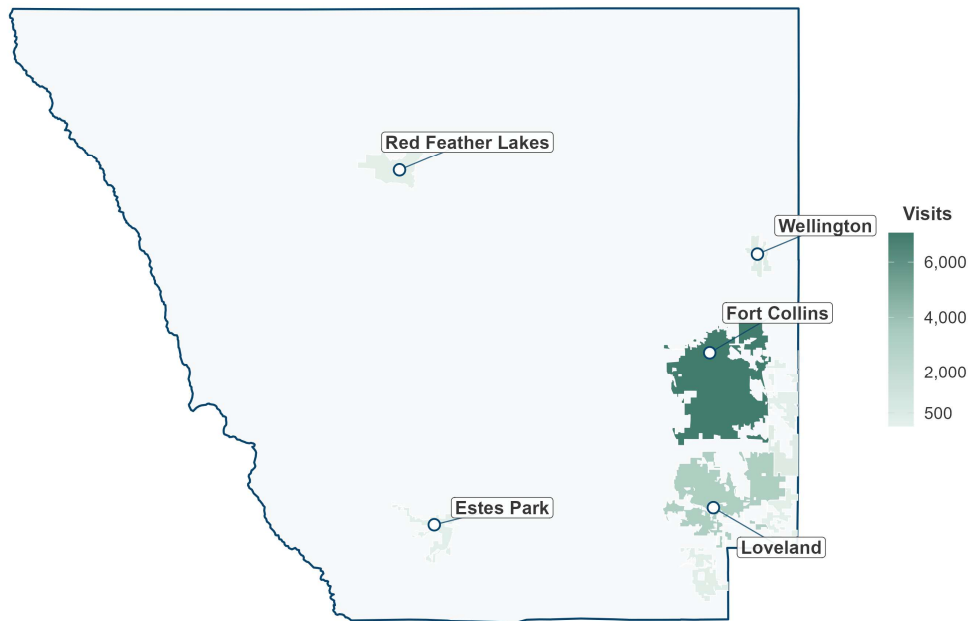

Geographic distribution of urgent care visits from Larimer County communities, 2024–2025 total.



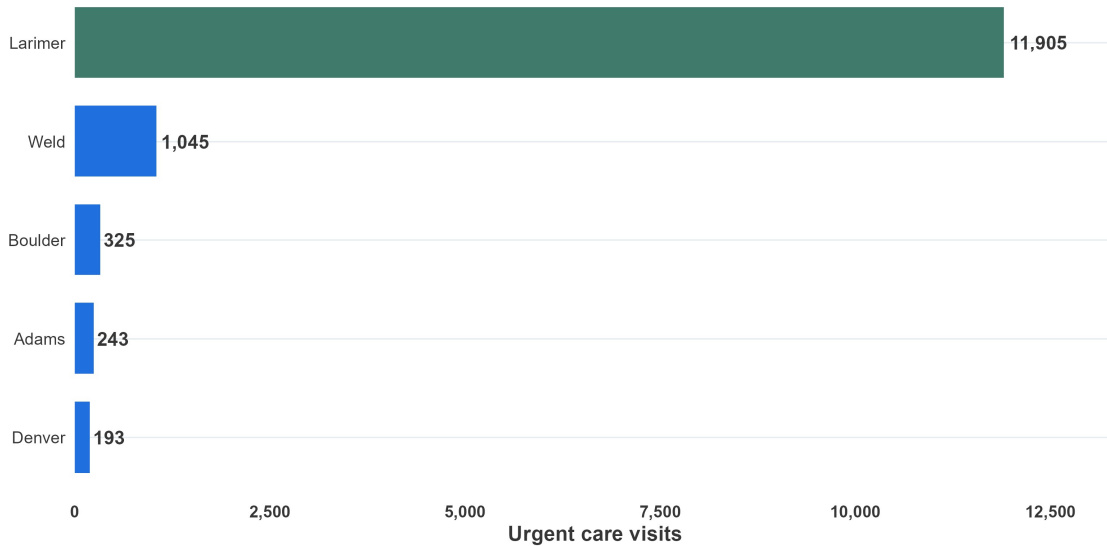

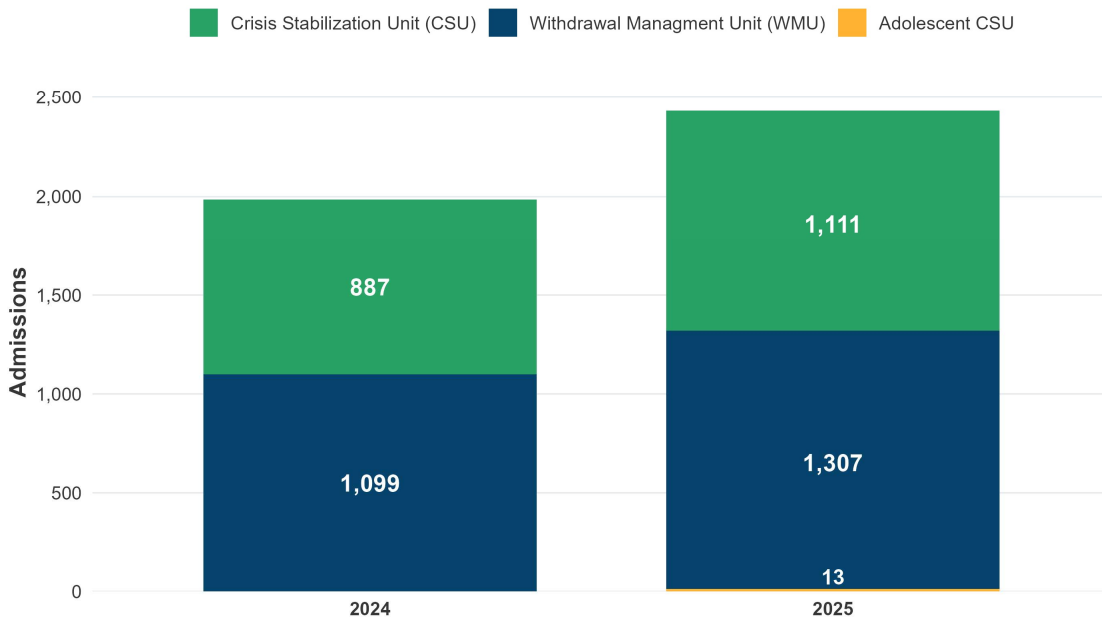

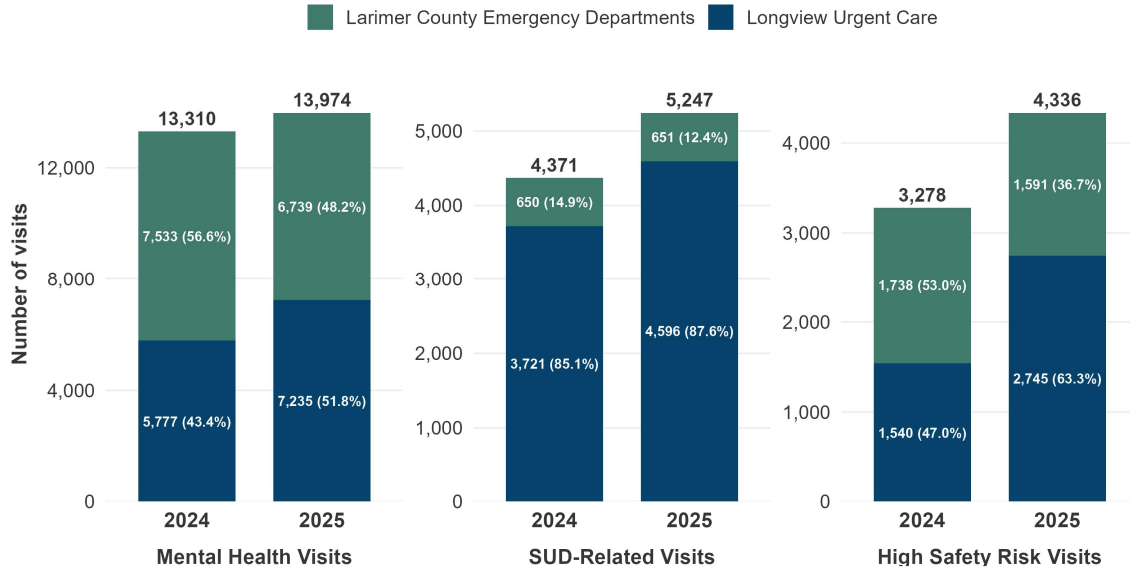
